WEEKLY REFLECTION

Today is the great Solemnity of Christ the King, one of the highest days in the liturgical calendar. The readings today invite us to remember the great promises God makes to us and give us a foretaste of what God has in store for us in the world to come. In looking over these passages from Scripture I think God is trying to do two things: excite us and unsettle us.

In each of the readings, we're given great cause to rejoice and be glad. The reading from Ezekiel, as well as in the psalm, uses a beautiful image found throughout scripture: God as a shepherd gathering in His flock. God seeks out each of us, feeds us, strengthens us, and makes a place for us with Him. Paul, in the second reading, reminds us that Christ has conquered death, and that it is God's desire for all of us to share in the life He won for us. And of course, the Gospel reading depicts Christ calling the righteous into the joy of the Kingdom of God. This is exciting news!

However, though the Scriptures today give us reason to be joyful, I think they also give us cause to be a bit uneasy. Each of these readings reminds us of the goodness God plans for His creation, but likewise, that God does expect a great deal out of us. Ezekiel reminds us of God's judgment and justice, Paul says that all things are going to be brought under Christ, and of course the parable shows us outright the curve which we're graded on: How have you helped the least among you?

In coming face to face with the King of the Universe one day, the King in His full glory, we must be prompted to humility. C.S. Lewis gives a great definition of this virtue: "Humility isn't thinking less of yourself, but thinking of yourself less." And at its core, the excitement of all these readings comes from humility, of looking forward to being in a right relationship with God and with others around us and doing as much as we can here and now to prepare for what that looks and feels like.

The unsettling and discomfort these words might prick within us likely is our own pride and self-concern worrying about our own place or our own situation in the Kingdom, and perhaps followed by the realization that we have some work to do if we want to be ready for it! Let us then look forward to the coming of the King, but likewise be prepared in the midst of our eagerness!




